Term 1

(Sign-up for internal competition and sub-committee already open)

8th October (Thursday week 1): **sign-up** for sub- committee **closes** online

13th October (Tuesday week 2): first meeting with sub- committee (1pm, room TBC)

15th/16th October (Thursday/Friday week 2): training judges how to judge (run by lecturers)

20th October (Tuesday week 3): **moot demonstration and social (7pm, venue TBC)** (to include; a brief moot, the judge's 'verdict', speeches by lecturers/a visiting solicitor on the value of mooting at university and speech by the Mistresses of the Moots. Social to follow immediately on.)

24th October (Saturday week 4): **sign- up** for internal moot competition **closes** online

25th October (Sunday week 4): pairings for internal moot and moot problem released (pairs will be required to prepare both sides of the argument as the top 50% will moot both sides)

26th- 30th October (week 4): mooting training sessions (from beginners to experienced mooters) running during this week (workshops to be run by sub- committee / lecturers / external trainers)

16th- 20th November (week 7): 1st year moots to be held this week

23rd- 27th November (week 8): 2nd/2nd/4th year moots to be held this week

28th-29th November (week 8): points added and top 50% of mooters to go through to 2nd phase of 1st round. This information will be released by email at the end of the week

30th- 4th November (week 9): 2nd phase of 1st round - top half of mooters will moot again (other side of the argument, therefore no need for more time to prepare arguments)

7th/ 8th December (week 10): overspill of second- round in the first two days of this week if necessary

9th December (Wednesday week 10): Sub-com to collect all final scores from 2nd phase of 1st round

12th December (Saturday week 10): best eight pairs (to go through to next round) released

20th December (Sunday Christmas Holidays): moot problem for 2nd round sent out (pairs will have all of the Christmas holidays to prepare for the 2nd round)

Term 2

11th – 15th January (week 1): Quarter-finals to take place this week (4 moots)

17th January (Sunday, week 1): Quarter-final results & semi-final moot problem released

1st – 5th February (week 4): Semi-final moots to take place this week

7th February (Sunday, week 4): Semi-final results & final moot problem released

8th - 12th March (week 9): provisional week for final to take place
